1 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Revenue

1.1.1 The principle

Pursuant to Commission Regulation (EC) N° 1238/95 establishing the rules for the application of the Council Regulation, (EC) n° 2100/94 as regards the fees payable to the CPVO and as last amended by Commission Regulation (EU) n° 2023/1104 of 07/06/2023, revenue is essentially generated from the following:

- fees paid by applicants for community plant variety protection;
- proceeds from the sales of the Official Gazette and the Annual Report
- interest on bank accounts.

1.2 Expenditure

The assumptions and methods of calculation on which the principal items of Title 1, Title 2 and Title 3 are based are included on the pages detailed by budget headings.

1.2.1 Title 1: Personnel

The establishment plan for 2026 foresees a total of 51 posts. These posts are broken down as follows:

The CPVO has 5 contract agents (CA) post allocated in various units.

Expenditure registered under Title 1 amounts to 11,565,000 euros representing a decrease of 0.9% compared to 2025.

An establishment plan can be found under point 4 (page 29) of this document.

1.2.2 Title 2: Building, equipement, various administrative expenditure

The forecast of expenditure on Title 2 amounts to 2,366,000 euros representing a decrease of 24.0% compared to 2025.

1.2.3 Title 3: Operational expenditure

Commitment appropriations registered under Title 3 amount to 7,972,000 euros representing a decrease of 9.3% compared to 2025.

1.2.4 Total expenditure

The total expenditure forecast for 2026 amounts to 21,903,000 euros for commitment appropriations and 21,906,000 euros for payment appropriations.

1.3 Deficit Reserve

The CPVO Financial Regulation's Article 17 establishes a Reserve Fund, which accumulates budget surpluses and deficits over the years to maintain financial balance.

In essence, the Reserve Fund acts as a buffer to offset negative budgetary results and is replenished by positive ones.

As of 2024, the Reserve Fund stood at 14,330,000 euros.

Projections indicate that the Reserve Fund will decrease to approximately 9,261,000 euros by the end of 2026, as a result of the forecast negative outturns of 4,038,000 euros in 2025 and 1,031,000 euros in 2026.

According to Article 17, if the Reserve Fund exceeds 50% of the annual commitment budget, the CPVO must analyse the situation and consider reducing the Reserve Fund. This could involve adjusting fees or implementing other measures

With the 2026 annual commitment budget set at €20,786,500, the Reserve Fund remains below the 50% threshold established in Article 17.

In conclusion, the CPVO acknowledges the current level of the Reserve Fund and will continue to monitor its evolution carefully, in particular after the completion of the new building project and in light of future application trends.

1.4 Conclusions and prospects

The total of commitment appropriations in the year 2026 amounts to 21,903,000 euros.

The total of revenue and payment appropriations in the year 2026 amounts to 21,906,000 euros.

With regard to *revenue*, the annual number of applications for protection reaching the Office, as well as the number of titles granted and fees collected subsequently, enables it to preserve a stable and solid financial structure.

With regard to *commitments* the trends are as follows:

- a decrease of 0.9% in staff expenditure;
- a decrease of 24.0% in administrative expenditure;
- a decrease of 9.3% in operational expenditure.

For the *payment appropriations* of the operational expenses, the decrease corresponds to 23.2%.

- expenses incurred in the consumption of water, gas, electricity and heating;
- maintenance costs, in accordance with the contracts in force (premises, lifts, central heating, air-conditioning equipment, etc.); cleaning costs (regular cleaning, purchase of cleaning products, washing, laundry & dry-cleaning products, etc.) and repainting, repairs and supplies required by the maintenance workshops;
